

Background

- Currently female urologists constitute 9.9% of the field and represent 14.2% of academic urologists in the United States.
- In 2019, 22.2% of urologists less than 45 years old were female, while only 11.3% of urologists 45-54 were female.
- In 2020, 29.7% of matched urology applicants were female.
- We sought determine the proportion of female speakers at high profile urologic meetings over time as a metric of female leadership.
- A cross-sectional analysis was conducted to identify the gender of conference speakers from 2014-2019 at 6 high profile urology conferences: AUA, SUFU, SPU, SUO, GURS, WCE.




Figure 1. Total practicing female urologist representation(blue) and total proportion of female representation as speakers at major urology conferences(red), per year.




Figure 3. Females urologist in 2019 (vertical line) compared to percentage of female speakers at urology conferences in 2019. When compared, statistically significant increase between female speakers at GURS, SPU, SUFU and AUA and total practicing female urologists (p<0.05).
