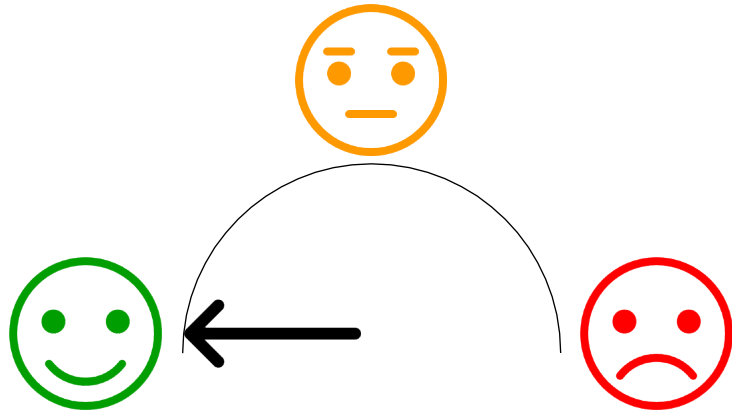

## FURTHER DEFINING WHICH OUTCOMES ARE ASSOCIATED WITH PATIENT SATISFACTION AFTER URETHROPLASTY

## OBJECTIVE:

- Determine the association between urethroplasty outcome measures and patient satisfaction.

## METHODS:

- Prospective study of 387 patients undergoing urethroplasty between 2012 and 2018
- Patients were administered questionnaires assessing urinary function, sexual function, pain and genital status preoperatively and 6 months postoperatively



# CONCLUSIONS

- Discrepancy exists between the surgeon reported experience and the patient reported experience following Urethroplasty with regards to satisfaction/success.
- Improved voiding function and improved standing voiding function are independently associated with patient satisfaction after urethroplasty.
- De novo penile curvature and de novo erectile dysfunction are inversely associated with patient satisfaction.
- These measures should be incorporated into any patient centered approach to urethral stricture.
- Cystoscopic success although potentially of interest from a surgeon perspective is not associated with patient satisfaction.
